

YORKSHIRE PHILOSOPHICAL SOCIETY: INDEX OF MEMBERS 1822-1855 (last revised April 2023)

New members were recorded in each YPS Annual Report. Current members were listed in full from **1824 to 1828**, then as separate appendices in **1831, 1834, 1837, 1839, 1842, 1844, 1849, 1852 and 1855**. NB: after 1828, full lists are not found in *loose* copies of Annual Reports held at the YPS Lodge, nor with the digitised Annual Reports available online at www.ypsyork.org/resources/, but only in the *bound* copies at the Lodge, in the YPS archives at the Borthwick Institute, and at York Explore Library and Archives.

Columns 1 and 2 of this index give **names, titles, honours**, etc., as in the published lists, with additional details in square brackets.

Columns 3 and 6 have been supplied by the compiler of the index: biographical information from sources below or as shown.

Column 4 gives the **member's address**: city, town or parish from published lists. York street addresses, not given before 1855, from other sources where found.

Column 5 gives **year of election to membership** (month added for 1822-23 only, from Committee minutes) **and year of death or departure, if known**. If unknown,

G = year by which member has **Gone** from published lists (which do not list members lost through death or resignation)

If no second date is shown, membership continues after 1855: see separate INDEX OF YPS MEMBERS 1855-1890 (in progress)

Names with * - indicates Honorary Member: see separate INDEX OF YPS HONORARY MEMBERS 1822-1890
