

YORKSHIRE PHILOSOPHICAL SOCIETY: INDEX OF MEMBERS 1855-1890 (April 2023: in progress)

New members were named in each Annual Report. Full lists of members were then published as separate appendices in 1855, 1857, 1858, 1860, 1863, 1866, 1877, 1885, 1889 and 1890.

NB: full lists are not found in *loose* copies of Annual Reports held at the YPS Lodge, nor with the digitised Annual Reports available online at www.ypsyork.org/resources/ They are found for most (but not all) years in the *bound* copies at the Lodge, or those in the YPS archives at the Borthwick Institute, or those at York Explore Library and Archives.

Columns 1 to 3 of this index give **names, titles, honours**, etc. and **addresses**, as in the published lists. Additional details from other sources, e.g. census returns or street directories, are given in square brackets. (NB: houses in many York streets have since been re-numbered.)

Column 4 gives **year of election to membership and year of death or departure, if known**. If unknown - members lost through death or resignation are not recorded - **G = year by which member has Gone** from published lists. **If no second date is shown, membership continues after 1890.**

Column 5 gives biographical information from sources below or as shown. **Dates of birth and death** are given when members can be identified with certainty. 'See *Members 1822-1855*' means more biographical detail may be found in that index for members elected before 1855.

Lady Subscribers: from 1830, women who paid an annual fee of £1 gained access to the Museum and Gardens. They were only listed from June 1855.

Associates: from 1850, men could also paid £1 annually for access to Museum and Gardens. They too were only listed from June 1855.
